## How to Apply for Co-Admission

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Complete the application for co-admission and submit it to the Clatsop Community College Office of Admissions with the \$50 non-refundable fee payable to Portland State University. If you are currently attending PSU as an admitted student, you need not pay the fee. If you are enrolling for the first time to either CCC or PSU, you must also submit official transcripts. To be official, transcripts must be submitted in the original, sealed envelope. Transcripts in languages other than English must be accompanied by certified English translations. If you are currently enrolled at CCC, CCC will forward to PSU any transcripts that it has on file. All other transcripts must be sent directly to PSU.

## Minimum Admission Requirements

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### **Freshman Admission** (fewer than 24 transferable college quarter credits)

1. Graduate from a standard or accredited high school with a minimum **3.0 grade point average** (GPA) in all graded subjects.
2. Take the SAT and/or ACT and have scores sent directly to Portland State University. Portland State University is school code 4610. No minimum score is required unless student does not meet minimum GPA requirement.
3. Complete 14 units of college preparatory work (courses must be completed with a grade of C- or better) or meet Oregon Proficiency-based Admission Standards (PASS) in the following areas:  
English: 4 years/units  
Mathematics: 3 years/units of math culminating in at least Algebra II level  
Social Studies: 3 years/units  
Science: 2 years/units  
Second Language: 2 years/units of, or demonstrated proficiency in, a second language. This requirement applies to all students graduating from high school or obtaining their GED in 1997 or any year after.

### Non-Accredited, Non-Standard or No High School Students

Graduates from non-accredited or non-standard high schools must earn a combined score of at least 1000 on the SAT Reasoning Test's Critical Reading and Mathematics sections, along with two SAT subject tests of the student's choice, earning a minimum of 470 on each subject test.

Alternatively, students may complete a **GED**. Students who earn a GED must earn a minimum overall average score of 580 and a minimum score of 410 on each subject test as well as meet the two-year language proficiency requirement. **Note:** if the GED was taken prior to January 1, 2002 students must earn a minimum overall average score of 46 and a minimum score of 40 in each subject.

### **Transfer Admission** (24 or more transferable quarter credits)

1. Meet minimum **GPA requirement: 2.25**, or 2.0 if presenting a transferable Associate's Degree.
2. All transfer applicants for Fall 2010 or after must have completed **WR 121** or its equivalent with a grade of C- or better prior to co-admission to PSU.
3. Meet the second language proficiency requirement described above if you graduated from high school in 1997 or after.

## International Student Admission

### **PSU**

1. Meet minimum cumulative GPA requirement of 3.0 for freshmen and/or 2.25 for transfer students.
2. All International transfer students applying for Fall 2010 or after must complete WR 121 with a C- or better either before admission or within one term of PSU enrollment.
3. English Language Proficiency Requirement: Applicants who meet the English language requirement may enroll in academic classes. Those who do not meet this requirement will be restricted to ESL classes. Applicants must present a minimum score of 525 on the paper-based TOEFL or a 6.5 on the IELTS exam to enroll in academic classes.

### **CCC**

To be admitted, you must meet the following requirements:

1. A paper-based score of 520 or above or a computer-based score of 190 or above on the International Test of English Language (TOEFL), or successful completion of and recommendation from an English Language Institute in the United States, or 30 quarter hours or 20 semester hours of transferable credits with a 2.5 grade point average or better from American colleges or universities.
2. The equivalent of a U.S. high school diploma.
3. A financial statement verifying that you have the financial resources to pay the normal expenses for one year's enrollment. You will be required to submit one year's tuition before final papers for immigration and college admission are issued. Applicants are accepted to begin in the fall, winter, or spring terms. The application process must be completed two months prior to the term you plan to attend. If you are interested in applying for admission, you should request an International Student Packet from the Admissions Office. The packet outlines the application procedures and application deadlines. A \$150.00 non-refundable international student application fee must be submitted with your application. This school is authorized under Federal law to enroll nonimmigrant students.

## Social Security Number Disclosure Statement

**CCC:** OAR 581-41-460 authorizes Clatsop Community College to ask you to provide your social security number. The number will be used by the college for reporting, research, and record keeping. Your number will also be provided by the college to the Oregon Community College Unified Reporting System (OCCURS), which is a group made up of all community colleges in Oregon, the State Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development and the Oregon Community College Association. OCCURS gathers information about students and programs to meet state and federal reporting requirements. It also helps colleges plan, research, and develop programs. This information helps the colleges to support the progress of students and their success in the workplace and other education programs

**PSU:** You are requested pursuant to ORS 351.070 and 351.085 to provide voluntarily your SSN to assist OUS (Oregon University System) and organizations conducting studies for or on behalf of OUS in developing, validating, or administering predictive tests; administering student aid programs; improving instruction; internal identification of students; collection of student debts; or comparing student educational experiences with subsequent workforce experiences. OUS will disclose your SSN only if the studies are conducted in a manner that does not permit personal identification of you by individuals other than representatives of OUS (and organizations conducting the study for OUS) and only if the information is destroyed when no longer needed for the purposes for which the study was conducted.

If you provide it, the colleges will use your social security number for keeping records, doing research, aggregate reporting, extending credit and collecting debts. If you choose not to provide your social security number, you will not be denied any rights as a student. Providing your social security number means that you consent to use of the number in the manner described. You may revoke your consent of the use of your SSN at any time by writing separately to Portland State University Office of Admissions and Records, PO Box 751, Portland, OR 97207-0751, and Clatsop Community College Office of Admissions 1653 Jerome Ave, Astoria, OR 97103.

## PSU Tuition Classification

Residency at PSU is determined in the evaluation of location of domicile, financial dependence or independence, primary purpose for living in Oregon, type and source of financial resources as well as other indicators. The primary determinant for residency is intent. That is, if you have moved to Oregon primarily for the purpose of obtaining an education, residency status is not granted regardless of elapsed time since moving to Oregon.

### You may be considered a resident if:

- You moved to Oregon for reasons other than to attend school
- You have lived in Oregon for at least 12 months before registering as a full-time student
- You are financially dependent upon an Oregon resident who has been living in Oregon for at least 12 months
- You are financially independent and meet A and B above
- You are a member of the armed services assigned to duty in Oregon
- You hold an A, E, H, K, L or other eligible visa or have been granted refugee or political asylum status.

### You may be considered a non-resident if:

- You enrolled in a college or university more than part-time (9 or more credits) within 12 months of moving to Oregon
- You have been claimed as a dependent on State and/or Federal tax returns by someone living in another state
- Your primary source of financial support comes from someone living outside of Oregon
- You are an alien possessing one of the following non-immigrant or temporary visas: B, C, D, F, J, M.
