GED Completion

The current version of the GED test will expire at the end of 2013. The current version, known as the 2002 Series GED test, will be replaced with the new 2014 GED test on January 2, 2014.

Those who have taken the 2002 Series GED test, but not passed all five parts, have until the end of 2013 to pass or they will need to start over again in 2014 with the new GED test in order to receive their high school credential.

"The GED test opens doors to college, better jobs, the respect adults deserve, and the satisfaction of earning a high school credential. So we want to be sure that everyone is aware of this deadline. **GED test-takers must act now to finish and pass before the current test expires.**

"Support is available, right here in Clatsop County," said Tom Gill, Director of Adult Basic Skills at Clatsop Community College. "We can help adult learners get prepared to take the parts of the GED test they still need to pass. We want you to succeed!"

Clatsop Community College (CCC) encourages all students currently in, or considering, the GED testing process to complete testing by the end of the year.

CCC is continuing to offer GED preparation classes and testing through December 6, 2013. To enroll in preparation classes or to schedule testing, please contact George Heiner in Columbia Hall Room 114 or call 503-338-2347.

GED preparation classes are offered in Astoria: Tuesday and Thursday, 9am-1pm and Monday and Wednesday, 9am-noon and 6:30-8:30pm; in Clatskanie: Monday and Wednesday, 6-9pm; and in Seaside: Monday and Wednesday, 4:30-8:30pm. The course fee is \$25 per term. The current GED test fee is \$135.

The Clatsop Community College Small Business Management Program (SBMP) has been part of the college's business-support opportunities for over 25 years. The SBMP is a structured ten month program that includes interactive classroom learning for three hours one evening a month and one-on-one confidential business advising for two hours each month. 
