Career Pathways

Four new Career Pathway Certificate Programs will be available at CCC beginning in Winter term 2013:

- Entry Level Accounting Clerk: A 14 credit program focusing on entry level accounting, computer and 10-key skill building.
- Accounting for Business Management: A 15 credit program providing instruction in accounting, payroll and business tax.
- Communications in Business: A 13 credit program emphasizing business English, composition and human relations skills.
- Entrepreneurship: A 22 credit program addressing business management, marketing, accounting, payroll and business tax.

Career Pathway Certificate Programs enable individuals to gain employment advantages in a targeted occupation or industry. By completing a Career Pathways Certificate Program at Clatsop Community College, students increase their qualifications for work opportunities, and then may advance over time to successively higher levels of education and employment.

Career Pathways provide avenues for career advancement for current workers, reentry into the job force for displaced workers, and opportunities for new entrants into the labor market. By targeting jobs of importance to the local economy, the Career Pathways Certificate Program also provides a supply of qualified workers for area employers.

Dick Powell, lead business advisor for the CCC Small Business Development Center, will be engaged in all elements of the program.

The Small Business Management Program is a fee-based, structured nine month program that includes interactive classroom learning for three hours, one evening per month; one-on-one confidential business advising for two hours per month; business tools, access to experts, and opportunities to exchange ideas and experiences with other small business owners.
