Patriot Hall Redevelopment



On November 11th, 1921 – Armistice Day – dedication ceremonies were held for Patriot Hall. Prominent Clatsop County resident H. R. Hoefer donated a large bronze plaque, which reads “Patriot Hall: Dedicated In Honor of Clatsop County Soldiers of all Wars.”

Ninety-three years later, Clatsop Community College students and community members continue to use Patriot for credit and non-credit courses in subjects ranging from nursing and music, to yoga and journalism.

Still, at 93 years-old, Patriot Hall is showing her age. CCC’s most visible building to anyone driving up 16th Street in Astoria has severe structural problems. Not only is the building’s foundation seismically vulnerable, but the bottom floor and portions of the third floor are no longer usable due to concerns about safety and accessibility.

The juxtaposition of 93 year-old Patriot Hall with completely redeveloped Towler and four year-old Columbia Halls on CCC’s main campus is striking.

A redeveloped Patriot Hall would include instructional space for new programs including: Paramedic/EMT; Drug and Alcohol Counseling Certificate; Exercise Physiology. In addition, Patriot Hall would include meeting space for student groups such as veterans and their families, a new gymnasium, multiuse space for dance, yoga and other credit and community education courses, and the region’s only indoor running track.

Due to the advocacy of Senator Betsy Johnson and Representative Debbie Boone, the people of our region have the opportunity to utilize approximately \$8 million dollars of State money to redevelop Patriot Hall, and to make it usable for the next 90 years.

At CCC we take great pride in acknowledging and affirming our history, and helping to create opportunities for the future.

This translates into huge savings for students to earn a bachelor’s degree—completing the joint program can save you up to \$9000. 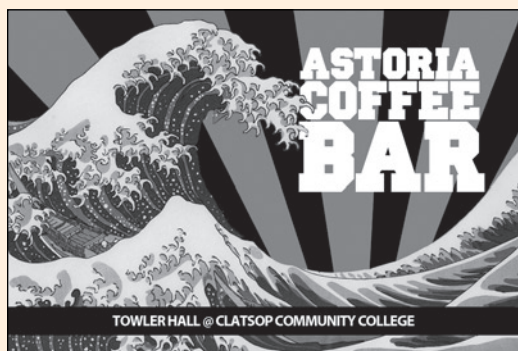
