3D Printing (TEC070133 - D1): Instructor – Lucien Swerdloff

How do objects get made? Designers determine how they look and how they work. 3D printers allow us to quickly build prototypes. Students will develop a concept, design an object, use 3D modeling software to build a model of the object, and use a 3D printer to create it. Ages 12-18.

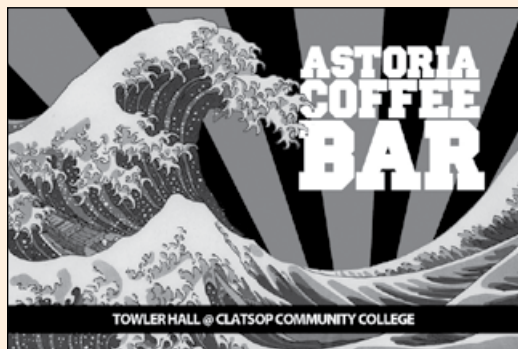
