Patriot Hall Redevelopment Project Update



CCC conducted the ceremonial groundbreaking for the Patriot Hall Redevelopment Project on Saturday, June 13. Dignitaries participating included Representative Deb Boone, Clatsop County Commissioner Lianne Thompson, Astoria Mayor Arline LaMear, Seaside Mayor Don Larson, CCC Foundation Chair Pat Lehman, the CCC Board of Directors, graduating student Josh Corder and CCC President Larry Galizio.

Site prep and utility work to accommodate demolition began June 15 with heavy demolition expected to begin approximately July 14. To accommodate access between Columbia and Towler Halls, a temporary walkway and lift that will be used for the duration of the project has been constructed. Construction-related staging is located along the southern edge of campus behind the Services Building and will necessitate a loss of approximately 40 parking spaces. Access to campus may be disrupted as needed during construction activity. Watch for flaggers and check the college website for periodic announcements.



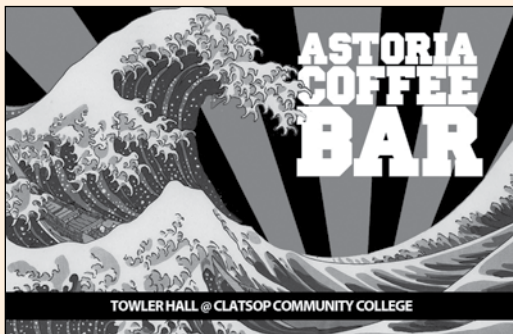
