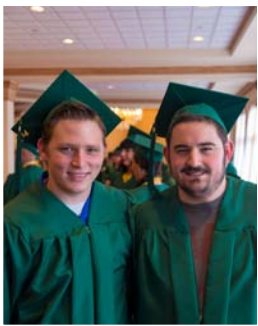
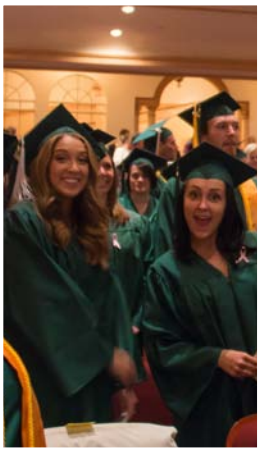

Start Planning Today For 2015-16 Scholarships and Financial Aid

January 1, 2015 is the first day you can apply for 2015-16 financial aid with the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

It is very important to file your FAFSA as early as possible beginning January 1, 2015. One important reason to file early is that some types of financial aid can be depleted as the year goes on depending on the volume of students applying for aid. As an example, the State of Oregon has a cutoff date of February 1 for reviewing eligibility for the Oregon Opportunity Grant. The State awards grants up to \$2,000 to eligible Oregon residents attending Oregon schools who complete a FAFSA on time. Please go to www.fafsa.gov after January 1, 2015 to start a 2015-16 FAFSA.

Clatsop Community College will also offer many scholarships to students attending in 2015-16. Scholarships are available in many major areas for those who have achieved academically. In addition, scholarships are available for first-generation college students, students entering non-traditional fields and students demonstrating need. A detailed list of scholarships, including eligibility requirements and online application information will be available on www.clatsopcc.edu approximately March 1.

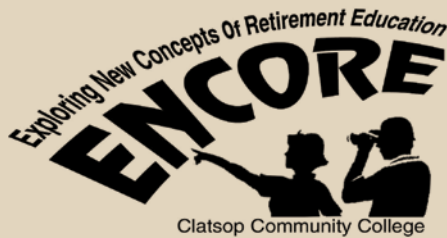

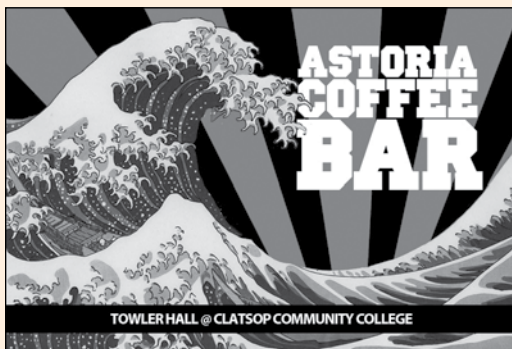
