Flyers, Brochures and Newsletters, Oh My! (TEC070140-D1)

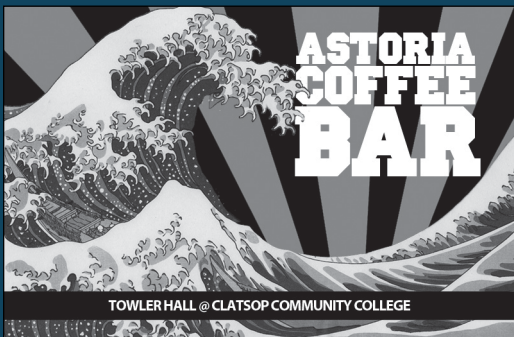
Do you get frustrated using Word to create brochures, posters, and newsletters? Microsoft Publisher is better equipped to handle such publications. In this 5-session class, we'll start from the beginning and learn how to design a layout on the Master Page, create and link text boxes, insert and resize photos, add headers and footers, check the document to see if Publisher finds any issues, and save as a PDF. We'll have plenty of sample files to use in class, but you are invited to create your own publications for your purposes. Students must have a basic knowledge of word processing.

Small Farm Sustainability: Best Practices (AGR983710-W1)

Explore best practices to help small farm operations step into sustainability. 1. BioIntensive Food Production, small plots, high yields. Maximize the amount of food grown for the soil. 2. Water catchment systems, how and how much is possible. 3. Wind and solar energy production and uses. What systems are currently available and what can you expect to produce with them. 4. Seed production and saving seed along with storing your harvest.

Opera Appreciation (PER009010-E1)

This class will cover musical, dramatic, and stylistic analysis of the component parts of opera and as well as appreciation and understanding of opera for the general public. We will trace its history, while examining its relationship to society and historical events. An investigation of the lives of the great composers of opera will also shed light on the form and meaning of many of the operas. Additionally, we will investigate the production of an opera, including set and costume design.

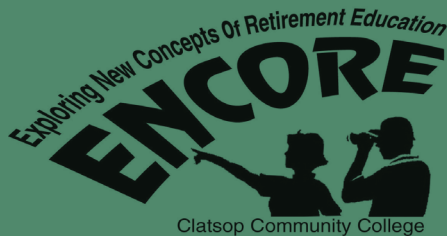
