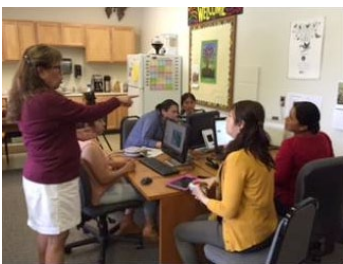
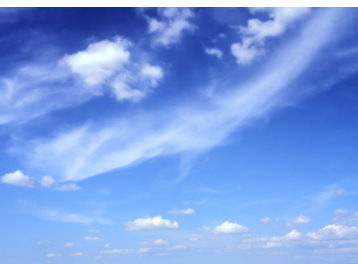
classes in Spanish and English that help students remove barriers to goals, enhance self-esteem, and develop a foundation of personal, educational, and vocational support.

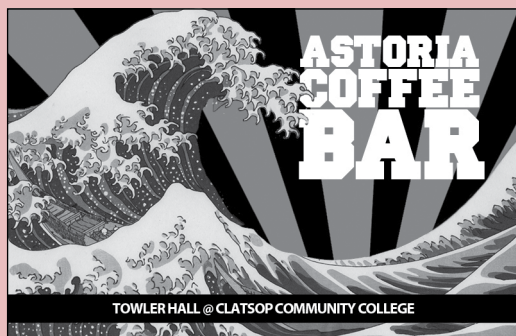
