
## **WINTER BREAK**



## Keys to Language Learning

Second language acquisition occurs when learners are exposed to language that is at or slightly above their level of comprehension.

Offer a balance of easier and more challenging materials. If you are concentrating on pronunciation, give the student practice with vocabulary they already understand, so they are not trying to learn new words and pronounce at the same time.

**Meaningful interaction and natural communication in the target language are necessary for successful language acquisition.**

Learners need to use the language, not simply hear their teachers speak it. Use role playing exercises from real-life, such as doctor visits, speaking, dictating and writing recorded phone messages, etc.

**Language learners can monitor their speech for correctness when they have time to focus their attention on form.**

Give your student enough time to self-monitor and self-correct. Watch the pace of your speech and delivery- SLOW DOWN. Repeat (and teach by example) what the student has just said, but with the correct grammar. Hearing it correctly will eventually become ingrained.
