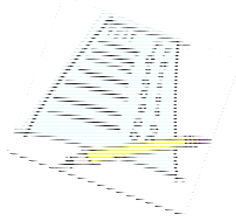

We are asking for the student to commit to consistent attendance.

A leveled class where all the students meet a certain standard is a wondrous thing in the world of ESL. Gains will be made by all because the instructors can focus on the needs of a few similar students instead of trying to make all levels get a little something from the class.
