Using Songs and Lyrics in Your Lessons

Some of our tutors have been using song lyrics with their students. This is a good way to lighten up after a strenuous lesson and an opportunity to put some variety in your lesson plans. We recommend early Beatles' songs for their accessibility- where no deep interpretation is necessary. Lyrics are easily pulled from the Internet, and we have a file of them here in the office. CDs are available for check out in the library. Or maybe you have songs at home you can take to your lesson, or your student has something they are interested in - call us if you need help downloading lyrics.

Most of the time, I recommend that you leave certain words or phrases blank and let the student try to fill them in. Usually, the student needs to listen 3 times get it right. Try it and let us know how it works. Thanks to Roberta M. for her idea to use songs.

If your student is an advanced ESL student, we highly recommend their participation in LIT. It will advance his/her English skills and provide experience in a class outside the literacy curriculum. There is now a Seaside LIT section so South County students will have an easier time accessing this offering.

Another ESL literacy student, Julio, recently finished his Spanish-language GED at the HEP program at the University of Oregon (a GED in English is also an option in HEP). This federally-funded 10-week program provides an opportunity for intensive study. Each student receives free room and board and a chance to experience campus life. Julio's success will enable him to search for a better job with his US certificate, has given him basic instruction in US history and society and confidence to continue studying. He is entering LIT Winter Term.
