3. Write a paragraph describing yourself as a good citizen using examples of how you have been and are a good citizen

Ron Miller Teachers Scholarship

Knappa teachers founded the Ron Miller Teachers Scholarship in an effort to provide assistance to worthy graduates of Knappa High School. To be eligible for scholarship consideration you must meet the following criteria:

1. Be a Knappa High School senior planning to obtain post-high school training at a four-year college/university, community college, or vocational school approved by the scholarship committee.
2. The recipient of the scholarship must enter school the fall term after graduation.
3. The recipient must have a cumulative high school grade point average of 2.50 or better.

To be eligible, students must fill out and submit an application form.

Timeline Information:

1. Money will be given at registration of the second term, or second semester, of post-secondary training.
2. **Deadline for submission of application: All applications must be turned into Mr. Chris Gremar in a sealed manila envelope with the applicant's name on the outside by 3:15pm on Thursday, April 28, 2017.**

KNAPPA SCHOOLS FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

Knappa Schools Foundation was organized in 1997 in collaboration with the Parents Club and other interested people in our community. It is a separate organization from the School District, although the goal to better the education of Knappa students is the same. The Board of Directors has established a statement fitting to the purpose of this organization. That statement is: **“To provide resources to enhance education and encourage personal success for the students of Knappa Schools”**. KSF scholarships are awarded to students with intentions of completing a four-year degree and have been a role model of good citizenship at Knappa High and in our community.

JONI WESTFALL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP - \$1000

This is KSF's newest Scholarship that is intended to be awarded to a student whose plan is to complete their education at Clatsop Community College or Lower Columbia College and is reserved for a student who lives at home or the student could pursue an online education or attend a trade school while living at home. The student must be in need of financial assistance. The student must have a true desire to receive an education. Student does not have to have a high GPA in order to qualify for this scholarship but should have a defined idea of what they would like to do as a career.

STEVE ALLEN, CPA (\$500)

This scholarship was established in 2003. Steve Allen, a Certified Public Accountant at No 10 Sixth Street in Astoria is the donor. Steve is a KSF Board member, his children attended Knappa Schools, and these scholarships exemplify his dedication to providing a resource for Knappa students to continue their education. Preference in awarding this scholarship will go to students who intend to pursue a business or accounting degree.

COLUMBIA BANK SCHOLARSHIP (\$500)

This scholarship is intended to provide recognition to an outstanding student who has excelled academically and has been exemplary as a role model of good citizenship in their school and community. The scholarship may be used at a university, college, community college or a vocational or trade program.

TEEVIN BROTHERS SCHOLARSHIP (\$1,000)

This scholarship is provided by Shawn Teevin of Teevin Brothers Land & Timber. Shawn is a KSF Board member and not only gives this scholarship but has contributed many other resources to Knappa Schools as well. The scholarship goes to a Knappa graduating senior with intentions to complete four years of college. Preference in awarding this scholarship will go to a student who intends to pursue a forestry or engineering related degree.

AUTIO COMPANY SCHOLARSHIP (\$500) - two

Autio Company was established in 1950 in the Knappa area and manufactures industrial food processing equipment that is now used throughout the U.S. and in 33 countries. The Autio Company scholarship will be awarded to a Knappa High School senior who demonstrates resourcefulness, the ability to set and accomplish goals and a concern for and involvement in the community. Preference will be given to applicants interested in pursuing training in engineering, manufacturing or a vocational or trade program, including agriculture. The Autio Company scholarship may be used at a university, college, community college or a vocational or trade program.

FORMER COASTAL FAMILY HEALTH CENTER SCHOLARSHIP (\$500)

This scholarship was created by the Board of Directors of the former Coastal Family Health Center. This scholarship is intended to help those youth with their education beyond their high school education who have a desire to enter the medical field. Character, leadership, financial needs and overall sincerity in gaining a lifelong career in the medical field to help others are consideration for this scholarship.

KATHERINE SALVON-McINTYRE SCHOLARSHIP (\$750)

This scholarship was established in 2004 by Katherine Salvon-McIntyre, a native of Knappa and a teacher in the Knappa Schools for 40 years. She began her teaching career in 1926 just out of Knappa Union High School, as she took Teacher's Training during her senior year and taught at Svensen Grade School in the afternoons. She served 20 years as Principal and teacher at the Knappa Grade School. She now resides at Clatsop Retirement Village and to some is still being called Mrs. Salvon. The Katherine Salvon-McIntyre Scholarship will be awarded with preference to a student who plans to pursue a career in teaching, has exhibited outstanding leadership qualities, has demonstrated the ability to set goals, and displayed academic excellence.

JOSH AMANA/MONTE KINSLEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (\$500)

Josh Amana was a Knappa High School student, FFA chapter member with a keen interest in agriculture. Monte Kinsley was a Brownsmead area dairyman and strong supporter of FFA and 4-H youth programs. The scholarship will be awarded to a first year college student with special consideration given to students interested in pursuing a career in agriculture. Recipient must have participated in either FFA or 4-H.

TRUAX FAMILY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP - Two (\$1,000)

This scholarship is intended to provide recognition to an outstanding student who has excelled academically and has been exemplary as a role model of good citizenship in their school and community. The scholarship may be used at a university, college, community college or a vocational or trade program.

PETER FISHER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (\$500)

Peter Fisher graduated from Knappa High School in 1992. He lost his battle with cancer in 2000. He was an active student, participating in athletics, drama and FFA. This scholarship is intended to encourage and recognize students who seek their education in the many facets of the school experience. This scholarship is provided to assist a worthy Knappa graduate who wishes to further their education at an accredited four-year institution of higher learning. The recipient must have demonstrated good citizenship and have participated in a variety of extra curricular activities.

ROGER SCHOENBORN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (\$500)

Roger Schoenborn was a Vocational Agriculture Teacher and Director at the Area Vocational Center in Astoria for many years and lived in Knappa where his children attended Knappa Schools. He served as Advisor to the Future Farmers of America and taught leadership, public speaking and parliamentary skills throughout his public school career. He was also an Occupational Specialist for Portland Public Schools and served as an Advisor to all Portland High School vocational youth group leaders. He believed in the leadership potential of young people and gave skilled and enthusiastic help to his many students. The scholarship will be awarded with preference to a student who plans to pursue a career in agriculture, has exhibited outstanding leadership qualities including active membership in a student leadership organization, has demonstrated the ability to set goals, and displayed academic excellence.

JOHN SCHUYLER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (\$500)

John Schuyler grew up in the Knappa area and graduated from Knappa High School. He starred both in football and basketball. In his adult life he was an avid supporter of all Knappa Schools activities and emphasized good grades and study habits to his children and their friends. Unfortunately John passed away in 2005 from Lou Gehrig's disease. The scholarship will be awarded to a student with good grades, plans to attend college but who is struggling to receive scholarships. A Student Aide who has helped in the Grade School may also be a qualification for this scholarship.

JOE ROHNE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (\$500)

Hans Jochen (Joe) Rohne was a Brownsmead dairyman who emigrated to Brownsmead at the age of 24 after escaping Communist East Germany with his parents and sisters. His three children all graduated from Knappa High School and all went on to earn University degrees. The scholarship will be awarded to a Knappa High School senior who will graduate with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher, has participated in a variety of activities and demonstrates outstanding character and citizenship. Preference will be given to students who have participated in either 4-H or FFA and plan to pursue an education in agriculture or international studies.

CORKILL FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP (\$500)

The Corkill Family Scholarship is being established by long time residents of the area. They have attended the local education system. Members of the family have been active on school budget committees, served as district board members and have been on the teaching staff for many years. The family now wishes to financially assist those who endeavor to continue their education. Good academic achievement, leadership, citizenship and community service are all qualities the recipient of this scholarship should demonstrate. This scholarship may be granted for technical, vocational, or a four year college or university. Pursuit of a degree in teaching will carry weight in determining recipient.

EARL NEWBERG SCHOLARSHIP (\$1000)

The Newberg Scholarship is being donated this year by Earl & Eleanor Newberg. His brother was inducted into the Wall of Fame during the 10th Annual Dinner held in March 2007. He was one of the first inductees into the wall of fame which will be announced every year at the foundation annual dinner. The scholarship committee will award this scholarship based on financial need, academic achievement, and outstanding community service or achievement.

KIVISTO FAMILY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (\$1,000)

Evelyn & Toivo Kivisto raised three girls who were very active in Knappa Schools, Charlotte, Judy and Patricia. Their mother was very active in PTA and both parents were avid fans of the sports program. This scholarship was established this year 2008 and is in their honor that this scholarship be awarded to a student with a burning desire to go on to college. We thank them for their contribution to this wonderful way to help another student achieve their goals.

TED & JUDY IVARIE SCHOLARSHIP – (\$500)

The Ivarie Scholarship was established in 2008 by husband and wife who both graduated from Knappa High School in 1956. They are giving back to this community by means of this scholarship that they have allowed the foundation to administer using our guidelines. We thank them for their contribution to this wonderful way to help another student achieve their goals.

CHRISTY MIETHE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (\$1500)

Christy Mieth graduated in 1993 from KHS. After graduating she went on to earn her nursing degree from Clatsop Community College and her bachelor's degree in nursing from OHSU. Eventually Christy found her passion was working as a Lower Columbia Hospice Nurse. Her patients and their families were her inspiration. Christy was diagnosed with brain cancer in June 2011 and passed away on December 21, 2011. To honor her memory the family has established this scholarship to be awarded to a KHS graduate aspiring to become a nurse.

ROBERT RANKIN SCHOLARSHIP (\$500)

Robert Rankin was a 2006 KHS graduate who excelled and lettered in multiple sports. He was well liked by all. He helped his father, a commercial fisherman, fish whenever possible. This scholarship was established in 2009 and will be awarded to a graduating Knappa High senior who will be attending a community, 4 year or vocational college on a full-time basis. The recipient must have demonstrated leadership, citizenship, service to his/her school and community, and have a love for life, outdoors and family.
