## HOW TO READ THIS SCHEDULE:

### COURSE NUMBER (COURSE#):

The number listed to the left of the course name that is needed to register for the class.

### CODES:

The key for the codes can be found on the bottom of the page in each section.

#### EVENING CLASS

#### ONLINE CLASS

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

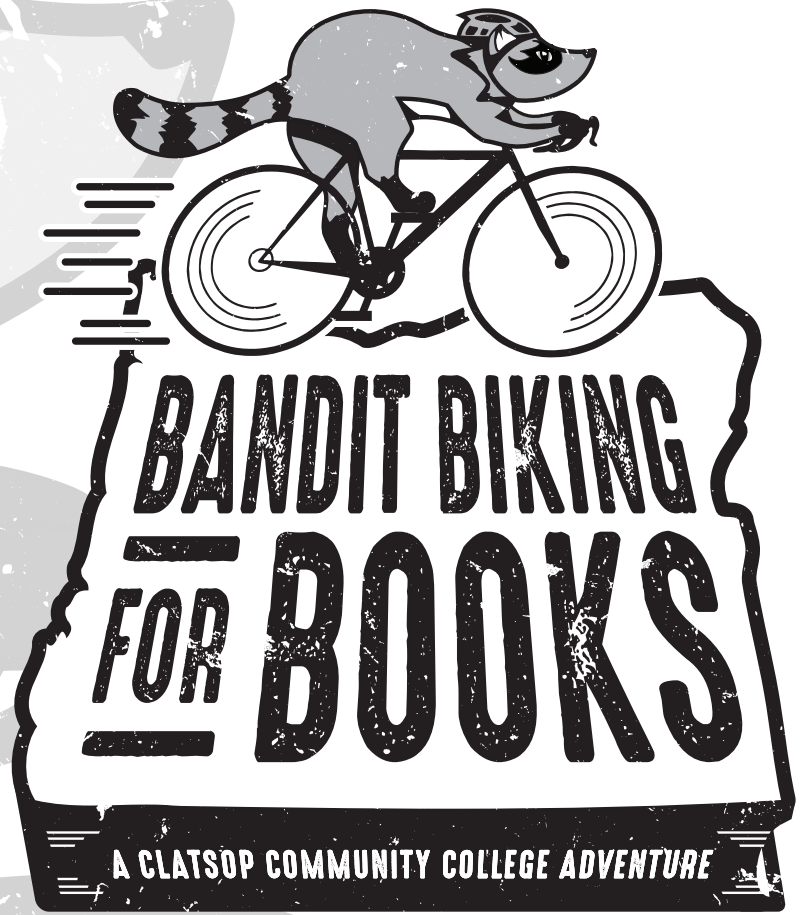
