HOW TO READ THIS SCHEDULE:

COURSE NUMBER (COURSE#):

The number listed to the left of the course name that is needed to register for the class.

CODES:

The key for the codes can be found on the bottom of the page in each section.

EVENING CLASS

Indicates that the class begins at or after 5:00 p.m.

ONLINE CLASS

All activities and course materials will be delivered online. There is no requirement for students to attend any activity at a specific time. Assignments will have deadlines throughout the term.
