2023-2024 Grant Funding Partners Provide \$285,000

The Clatsop Community College Foundation is pleased to announce that funding to replace the aging Air Tank (SCBA) fill station used by the CCC Maritime Science and Fire Science programs has been secured. Thanks to a \$50,000 grant from The Roundhouse Foundation and a \$50,000 grant from a generous donor, the new fill station was recently ordered and is expected to be ready for use by Spring term 2024.

"The Maritime Science and Fire Science programs bring 1,500 students annually from around the globe to CCC. This grant will help keep students coming to our premiere facility as well as serve as a back-up system for our local fire departments if there is a sizable incident in the county." **Tony Como, CCC Fire Science Assistant**





An additional \$55,000 grant from the generous donor will fund critical upgrades to the Fire Response Research Center (FRRC) to meet the National Fire Protection Association standards and extend the usable life of the building.

- 2) \$100,000 grant to increase the admitted student capacity admitted into the 2024-25 first year nursing cohort.

Community Partnership

Columbia Memorial Hospital continues its support of the Clatsop Community College Nursing Program through the annual gift agreement with CCC and the CCC Foundation. This gift helps support the salary for a nursing instructor each year. Judy Geiger, VP of Patient Care Services at CMH says:

"The nursing students from CCC are the core of our nursing workforce. We would not be able to staff the hospital without being able to hire the wonderful new graduate nurses from the CCC Nursing Program. They assure we can provide safe, high quality person centered care to our patients. We value our partnership with CCC."

Doris Jepson, CCC Director of Nursing and Allied Health shared that in addition to contributing to the sustainability and quality education to CCC nursing students, CMH also provides clinical opportunities in its hospitals and clinics, contributes supplies and equipment, and participates on Clatsop CC's Nursing Advisory Committee.

All of CCC's 2023 Nursing program graduates passed their national licensure exam (NCLEX-RN) on their first attempt and seven (39%) of the graduates are now working at Columbia Memorial Hospital.

TAX SAVING TIP from the Clatsop Community College Foundation

GIVE PART of your IRA DISTRIBUTION to the CCC FOUNDATION

If you are age 72 or older, asking your IRA administrator to send your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) to the CCC Foundation will keep your RMD from being counted as taxable income.

Receiving a RMD increases taxable income, whereas making a charitable gift with your RMD does not.

<u>Here is an example:</u> Betty and Billy Bandit, both age 72, are required to take a \$5,000 Required Minimum Distribution from their IRA. This distribution increases their taxable income from \$100,000 to \$105,000. The Bandits usually don't itemize their taxes, using their collective \$25,000 standard deduction instead.

If The Bandits tell their IRA administrator to give the \$5,000 Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) directly to the Clatsop Community College Foundation:

- Clatsop CC Foundation will receive \$5,000
- The Bandits will avoid paying taxes on their IRA RMD
- ◆ The Bandits will only pay taxes on \$100,000 in taxable income
